## Raymer's Mini We Day for Grade 6

"WE DAY" Critique from parent- brought concerns to sd23 regarding the we day corporate organization's human rights violations, bullying tactics, targeted marketing schemes to impressionable youth. -parents present discussed they are impressed with Raymers school based decision in 2016 to host a mini leadership event at Raymer so that it is more inclusive for all the grade 6 students, rather than the way it was before with a select few students chosen to attend We Day in Vancouver.
-Parents all in agreement that the concept of it as a student Leadership event is valuable, and appreciate all the work that goes into this sleepover event by staff and parent volunteers.
-suggestion for Raymer Elementary to change "brand" to not be tied to "WeDay"... and instead as stand alone "student Leadership" event, grade 6 students to be involved in the naming of event -RayCOPAC rep suggested parent to bring concerns to sd23 human rights committee and COPAC

## PAC financial contribution to "WeDay" food.

At Oct Meeting $\$ 400$ was approved to purchase food and supplies for 2 snacks, Dinner, Breakfast and Lunch for the Grade 6 sleepover at Raymer
-PAC also donated Kernels Popcorn (valued @ \$43) for the evening snack to help keep it under \$400. -The Volunteer that purchased food spent $\$ 89.62$ over budget.
Members present voted to pay only the approved $\$ 400$. School had to pay the extra cost. also discussed the importance of not going over budget--Going forward its suggested that a PAC Executive member purchases food then the purchaser is held accountable to not go over budget. -This event needs to be sustainable each year....
2016-1st year $\$ 397$ spent, $\quad 2017-2$ nd year $\$ 300$ spent ( $\$ 100$ of food donated).
