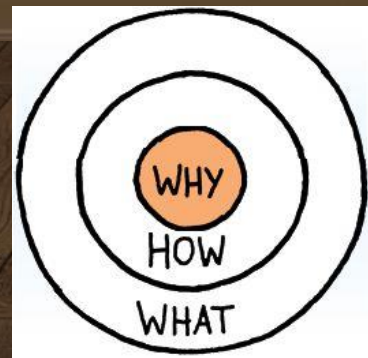

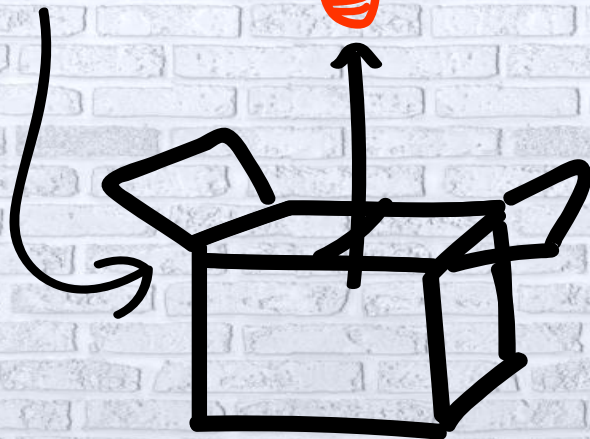

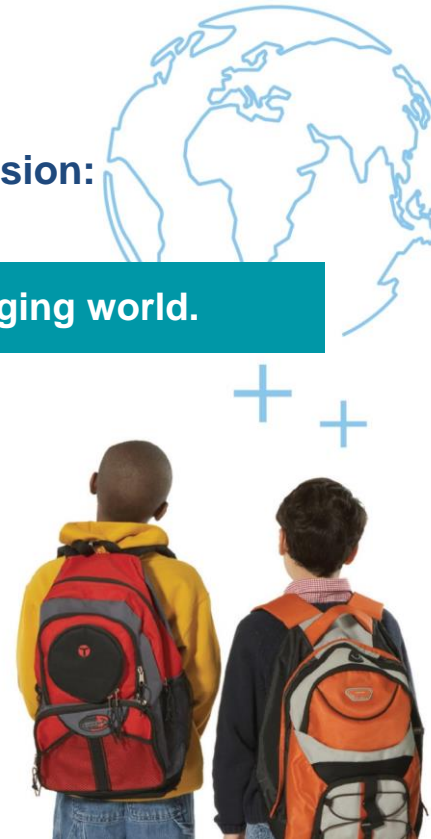
Vision/Planning 2017

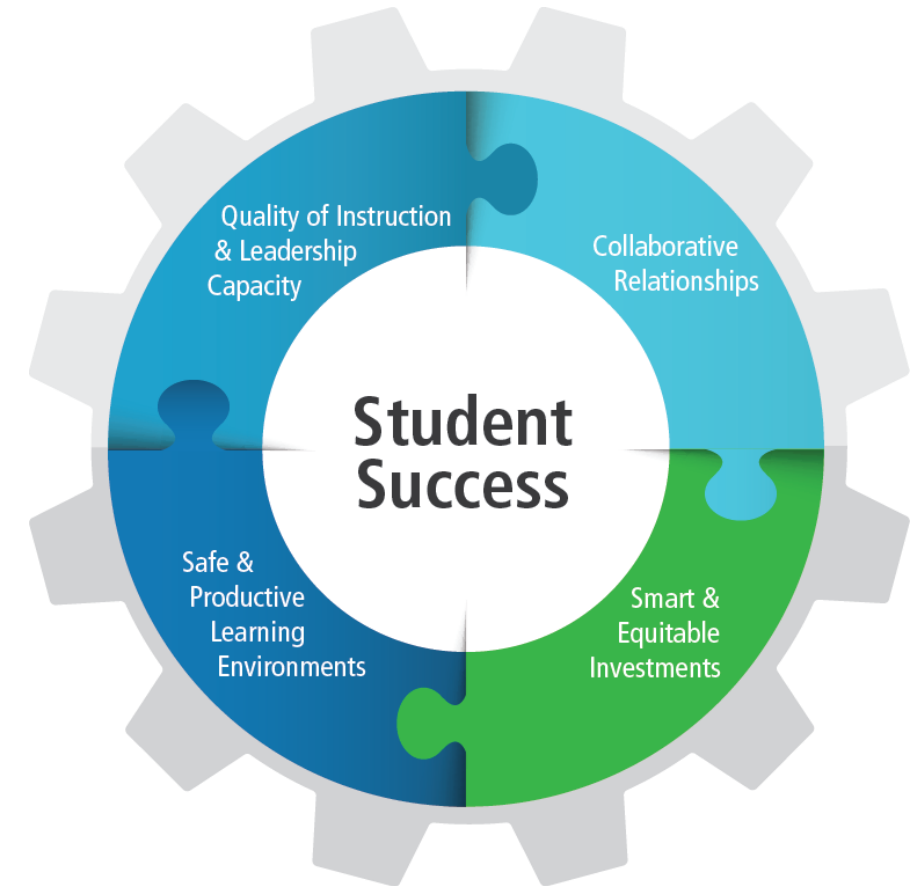

As we implement the re-designed curriculum, our key focus in order to deepen learning for our students is to shift the role of our learners, and increase *learner agency* through more personalized learning:

- Learning designs based on the OECD Innovative Learning Environment Project’s 7 principles of learning.
- The indigenization of the curriculum using the First People’s Principles of Learning.

FIRST PEOPLES PRINCIPLES OF LEARNING

Learning ultimately supports the well-being of the self, the family, the community, the land, the spirits, and the ancestors.

Learning is holistic, reflexive, reflective, experiential, and relational (focused on connectedness, on reciprocal relationships, and a sense of place).

Learning involves recognizing the consequences of one's actions.

Learning involves generational roles and responsibilities.

Learning recognizes the role of indigenous knowledge.

Learning is embedded in memory, history, and story.

Learning involves patience and time.

Learning requires exploration of one's identity.

Learning involves recognizing that some knowledge is sacred and only shared with permission and/or in certain situations.

Curriculum

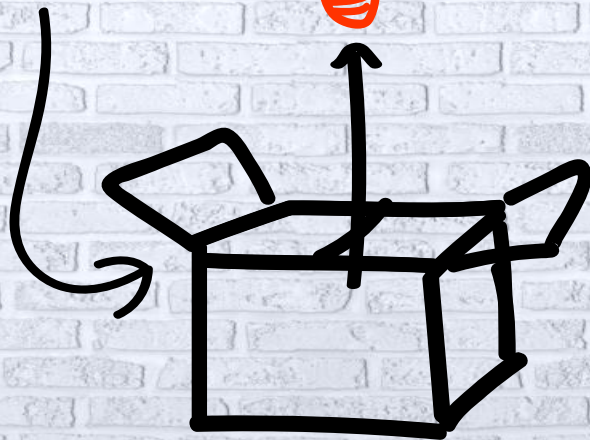
- First year of implementation 2016/17
